# Secreto a voces [An open secret]

### Introduction

In these contemporary times of immediate communication, 'free' display of thoughts, and a permanent sharing of personal information stimulated by social networks, I feel a need for a shared expression space that holds a sense of privacy while nourishing social trust.

This score stimulates both respectful and creative sharing of deep individual needs (secrets) while building collective trust, experiencing the strength of distant sonic and social interconnections.

## Preparation

Create a circle of three people living in distant locations.

The circle shares emails.

The circle agrees: a software to connect[1], a day and time to perform, and the order in which the participants will be 'speakers', according to their location on the planet (e.g. moving from East to West, or from South to North), so everyone will have the chance to speak, crisscrossing the planet. At the agreed time the members of the circle will know who is the first speaker and the order. A moderator needs to be chosen.

## Salutation

The moderator makes sure that all connections have been established and all participants are online.

The moderator invites participants to breathe, and each member of the group introduces herself by saying "Hi" "Name" "Geographical Location" and "Mind location" (in any language) e.g. Hola, Ximena, Londres, Heart, and adding a free gesture of salutation (visual and/or sonic, depending on the software) to which the others will respond by greeting back with the same greeting. When the salutations have finished,

Everyone keeps silence, waiting for the first speaker to start. The performance starts.

## Speaker 1 and subsequent speakers (25" per person)

In your most quiet time Listen to your inner voice Listen to a secret [2] that you need to express And that your inner voice trusts with you Amplify it in a whisper which only you could understand Repeat it as many times as needed, and gradually transform the whisper into sounds that cannot be fully formed as words

When ready, voice these sounds one time to the circle Wait for their echoes And listen for the trust After having heard all the echoes respond immediately with a word or sound that you trust

Give mental space for the next speaker And become a listener

## Listeners

Choose a response delay time from 1 to 5 seconds Or trust the delay of the long distance transmission medium

Listen to a secret that is trusted to you by a distant speaker Receive it in a warm sonic space of understanding Beyond language(s) Fill gaps of the whisper with verbal sounds that emanate from the heart As if in a new private language of secret protection Amplify the secret back to the speaker in that new language Reaffirming the bonds of trust

Listen for the response of the speaker As if in a mutual trust

If it is your turn, become a 'speaker' If it is not, listen for the next 'speaker' and start again the cycle.

When the go around returns to the first person who acted as a speaker, all speakers voice aloud, once and with a time delay from 1 to 6 seconds, the transformed secrets in a new secret language directing these voices to a place in the world where they would like to be heard.

Everyone listens in their mind for the echo coming from those places Silently thank your trust circle, gradually grounding yourself in the physical place where you are (e.g. feeling your feet on the ground). When you are ready, disconnect from the group with a smile.

Offline, continue listening for echoes while awake and in your dreams Until the need has been fulfilled (a response has been received). When the need is fulfilled Each participant sends a sonic gift of gratitude to your fellow circle listeners via email

It doesn't matter if the fulfilment takes seconds, hours, days or years.

## Notes

1. This score is for a group of people connected through a bi-directional streaming audio software that suits all. I recommend: Jacktrip, Soundjack, Google Hangouts, or Zoom. For mobile: LiveShout (bi-directional for IPhone) or LocusCast (unidirectional), together with Locus Map. It requires headphone listening, and binaural microphones if possible—otherwise participants can use any available microphone. In some software, panning options could be used. If participants have binaural microphones, and the streaming software is stereo, the *speaker* will speak in the right ear of the microphone, and the *listener* will respond in the left ear of the microphone. The mics are open all the time during the performance, both for speakers and for listeners. This effect will identify acoustically the speaking/listening experience, holding symbolically the secret in-between the two ears.

If mobile software is used, public spaces can be used to increase the intensity of the expression of the secret. 2. Speakers can prepare secrets in advance of the performance, and use the available time to connect to these.
